Corresponding letters were called for—Received one from South Union, by her Messengers Felix Foley and Hezekiah McKeehan—Their next Association will be held at Good Hope, Campbell County, Tennessee, on Friday before the 4th Saturday in September, 1865—Received one from Cumberland River, by Elders R. J. Shadowen and G. Bolen. Their next Association to be held with Mt. Pleasant Church, Pulaski County, Ky., on Friday before the 1st Saturday in September, 1865—Received one from North Concord, by her Mesenger Elder J. N. Maddocks. Their next Association will be held with Brush Creek Church, Knox County, Ky., on Friday before the 3d Saturday in September, 1865.
- 3d. This Association will hold their next session with Rough Creek Church, Laurel County, Ky., on Friday before the 1st Saturday in October, 1865.

4th. Brethren Henry C. Harman, C. W. Jones and Thos. Box were appointed to write to corresponding Associations.

5th. Brethren Hugh Sturgeon, W. C. Brummet and J. M. Bolton with the Moderator and Clerk were appointed a committee of arrangements. Adjourned until 10 o'clock Saturday.

Saturday Morning 10 o'clock.

Prayer by Elder J. N. Maddocks.

1st. The arrangement of the committee was called for, read, and received.

2d. Elders J. Woodall, George Bolen and George Brock were appointed and requested to preach to-day, and Elders J. N. Maddocks, R. J. Shadowen, George Bolen, H. D. Harman and G. B. Foley were requested to preach on Sunday.

3d. Ordered that this Association drop correspondence with South Union Association, and gives as her reasons—being called on by her for a remedy—we know of no other remedy than to refuse to correspond with her.

4th. Letters to corresponding Associations were read, and received, and the following brethren were appointed to bear them: To North Concord—H. D. Harman, E. R. Jones, W. K. Davis, J. C. Westerfield and W. M. Johnson—To Cumberland River—R. D. Goin, Ragan Brock, C. W. Jones, Abraham Surginer and Hugh Sturgeon.

5th. Elder W. K. Davis to preach the next introductory sermon, C. B. Foley his alternate.

6th. Ordered that the brother Clerk superintend the printing of the minutes and that we have 500 copies printed.

7th. Ordered that we tender our sincere thanks to the citizens in the vicinity of Meadow Creek for their hospitality and kindness.

8th. Ordered that we adjourn until our Association in course.
