OF THE  
LONG RUN ASSOCIATION

Met at Flat Rock, on the first Friday in September 1827.

A Sermon was delivered by Elder John Holland from 10 Chapter Hebrews 23-24 & 25 verses. Letters from the Churches composing the ass. were call.d for read and messengers were enrolled as follows.

The Ass.o then proceeded to the choice of Moderator & Clerk, wherein, Geo. Waller was chosen Moderator & Zacheus Carpenter Clerk.

Letters from corresponding associations call.d for and read as follows, and the messengers took their seats.

Blue River— a letter was receiv.d but no messenger.

Elk Horn— Edmond Waller.

Salem— Warren Cash & Daniel Walker.

Franklin— John Taylor & Jn.o Crutcher.

Licking— a letter was recv.d but no messenger.

South District, S. Stone, J. Chaplin & Lewis Wilhide.

Concord— Jn.o Scott.

Sulpher Fork— Jn.o A.M'Guire, Isaac Foster.

A letter was recv.d from a newly constituted church at the Fish Pool, praying admittance into the association, which was cordially agreed to, upon which the messengers, Joshua M'Cally, E. Applegate & Squire Davis, were Recv.d by the right hand of fellowship, & took their seats.

The circular letter written by Elder B. Allen was call.d for, read, and after some discussion adopted. Brethren appointed to write to corresponding associations— Jn.o Dale to Licking, S. Vancleve to Concord, S. Dupuy to South District, A. Keller to Salem, W. C. Foster to Blue River, Jn.o Stogden to Sulpher Fork, Wm. Markwell to Elk horn. The Moderator, Clerk, S. Vancleve & B. Allen appointed a committee of arrangement and then adjourn.d untill 9 O'Clock A. M. to morrow.

Saturday half after 9 O'Clock A. M. met and after praise & prayer proceeded to business.

The report of the committee was call.d for, read recv.d and the committee discharged.

Agreed that Brethren Jn.o Scott, Warren Cash, Daniel Walker, A. Nuckols, Jn.o M'Guire & William Rice make their own selection, so that four of them occupy the stage to day.

The next association to be holden at Salem Meeting house, Shelby County, on the first Friday in September 1828.

Agreed that the Saturday before the first Sunday in November next be set apart as a day of thanks giving

to the Lord for the wonderfull displays of his Grace lately in many parts of the world, in turning many, yea verry many from darkness to light.

Agreed that union meetings for the ensueing year, be as follows-- 5th Sunday in the present month & two previous days, to be at Louisvill-- the 2d to be at Shelbyvill -- the 3d to be at Fox Run -- the 4th to be at Kings -- & 5th at Eighteen Mile-- the following Brethren agreed to attend at Bruners Town, in the ensueing year-- Elder D. Standeford on the 4th Sunday in October, Jn.o Holland 4th Sunday in November, Z. Carpenter 4th Sunday in December, R. Cotrell 4th Sunday in January, J. B. Curl 4th Sunday in February, E. Davis 4th Sunday in March, Jn.o Dale 4th Sunday in April, Geo. Waller & J. Hulsey 4th Sunday in May, S. Vancleve 4th Sunday in June, F. Davis 4th Sunday in July, Wm. Stout 4th Sunday in August. Letters call.d for to the corresponding associations and messengers appointed to bear them--

To Elk horn, Geo. Waller, Ja.s Roberts, Jn.o Dale, J. B. Curl, Geo. Bridges. To Salem, Sam.l Vancleve, J. Shadbourn, Wm. Stout, J. Hulsey, Apolus Hess, Jn.o Dale.

South District, Jn.o Holland, Sam.l Shanks, Joshua Brooks, N. Beaucamp, J. McClane, B. Allen & E. Davis, Blue River, whereas it appears that the Blue River association is now in cession in consequence of its being govern.d by second Saturday, and as her next cession will be after our next, that we pospone writing untill our next association. The Licking also being in the same situation we pospone in like manner. Concord, Sam.l Vancleve, Zacheus Carpenter. Sulpher Fork, Joel Hulsey, Jn.o Dale, Sam.l Vancleve, Jn.o Stogden & George Bridges.

Proceeded to choose by ballot Brethren to preach on to morrow, to preach the next introductory sermon, & to write the next circular letter. as follows-- Jn.o Taylor, Jn.o Scott & Edmond Waller to preach on tomorrow. Geo. Waller to preach the next introductory, & in case he fail, David Standeford, Jn.o B. Curl to write the next circular. Money collected to pay for printing minutes, & Brethren Sam.l Dupuy & Sam.l Shanks to superintend the same. Agreed that

we appropriate 100 copys of our minutes to corresponding associations. Worship to begin at 10 O'Clock to morrow. Adjourned.
