"Prayer should be the breath of our breathing, the thought of our thinking, the soul of our feeling, and the life of our living, the sound of our hearing, the growth of our growing." "Prayer in its magnitude is length without end, width without bounds, height without top, and depths without bottom. Illimitable in its breadth, exhaustless in height, fathomless in depths, and infinite in extension."

The Field is far away but the needs are great. The Work is new and for that reason we especially need your Prayers.
