

The Academic Colors

The academic colors of The Southern Baptist Theological Seminary are scarlet and gold. Scarlet represents divinity and reflects Christ's crucifixion. Gold is a royal color and signifies the sovereignty of God. The seminary banner has three reversed gold chevrons against a scarlet background representing the trinity. Based upon this symbol is the seminary seal with the dove, the Holy Spirit, above an open Bible.

The satin lining of the academic hood repeats the three reversed gold chevrons upon a scarlet background. The size and shape of the academic hood emphasizes the degree level — the Doctor being the larger and the Master being the smaller. The velvet border of the hood is emblematic of the degree earned — dark blue for Philosophy, scarlet for Theology, light pink for Music, light blue for Education, and citron for Social Work.

The academic cap may be either the traditional black mortarboard or represent by shape or color the highest degree of the wearer or the institution granting the degree. The tassel color is also indicative of the degree field. The gold tassel is reserved for the doctorate.

The academic gown by its design may indicate the level of the degree. The use of color in the chevrons on the sleeve may indicate the field of the doctorate or the color of the gown may indicate the institution granting the degree. Both design and color are always symbolic.

The presiding officer wears the seal of the seminary indicating that he is authorized to act on behalf of the institution in formal convocation.
