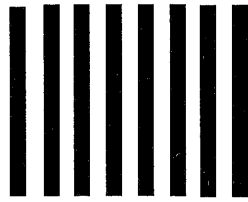

## The Featured Speaker



**Dr. Dallas Albert Willard** is Professor and past director of the School of Philosophy at the University of Southern California. He is a Southern Baptist minister who is a graduate of William Jewell College, Tennessee Temple College, Baylor University, and the University of Wisconsin. He has been the

recipient of the "Outstanding Faculty Member" and "Excellence in Teaching" awards given for outstanding contributions to student life at USC.

Dr. Willard has written two excellent books on spirituality entitled *In Search of Guidance* (Ventura, CA: Regal Books, 1984) and *The Spirit of the Disciplines* (San Francisco: Harper and Row, 1988).

He has also produced numerous articles for such publications as the *Sunday School Lesson Illustrator*, *Christianity Today*, *The Student* and *Christian Spirituality*.

**B. Spirituality and Ethics in Supervision.** This workshop will explore the intimate and multifaceted relationship between spirituality and ethics in the Christian life, emphasizing the centrality of spiritual growth for progress in the Christian moral life. **Leader:** David P. Gushee

**C. Spirituality and Story.** The workshop will explore the capacity of stories to tell us who we are and to help us search for meaning in life. The literature of narrative theology and Christian spirituality will offer resources for supervision. **Leader:** Denise M. Massey

**D. Growing in Christ at Southern Seminary.** Examination of how one can grow in Christ. **Leader:** Douglas C. Walker

**E. Spirituality and the Myers-Briggs Type Indicator.** MBTI as a vehicle for understanding spiritual formation, faith development, and gifts. Supervision techniques for the use of the MBTI in these capacities. **Leader:** Jon W. Rainbow

**F. Spirituality and Church History.** What does the long memory of the Christian movement tell us about the nature of the spiritual life? This workshop will explore some of the options. **Leader:** Timothy P. Weber

**G. Human Growth & Development and Faith Issues.** An examination of developmental and growth tasks as they relate to faith development. **Leader:** Sharon Sanders

**H. Spirituality and Theological Reflection: Guiding Students Toward Authentic Ministry.** A dialogue regarding strategies for assisting students to grow toward spiritual self-integration. Case material will guide discussion of ways to help seminarians hold their hearts and minds together in the practice of ministry. **Leader:** Charles J. Scalise

**I. Using our Personal Brokenness as Empowerment in Supervision.** Explore and clarify various sources of pastoral supervisory empowerment with special attention given to Henri Nouwen's perspective on the inward brokenness of the minister as a source of empowerment. **Leader:** Jim Fleming

**J. Spirituality and the Black Church.** A presentation that asserts that authentic spirituality involves an understanding of the church as that community of and for the abused, neglected, forgotten, rejected and oppressed. **Leader:** T. Vaughn Walker

**K. Object Relations and Ministry Supervision.** The process of ministry supervision will be examined in light of the contributions of the British school of object relations theory. **L. D.Min. Sectional Meeting.** A workshop for D.Min. supervisors concerning expected administrative functions. The focus is upon supervisory relationships to students, faculty supervisors, and the D.Min. Office. To be continued Wednesday morning.
